There's a cooking activity in every club. It's to educate our members and gives them new life skills, it feeds members alongside their friends so they don't become isolated. Many of our members don't have healthy eating habits or any cooking skills. Our training kitchen allows all members the opportunity to use kitchen equipment, prepare food and cook it. These are skills which they can take home and use with their parents and when they go on to become adults. The training kitchen hosts group cooking activities. The youth workers identify young people who they know are living in poverty and who are not eating at home. By targeting these members and encouraging them to cook alongside others, they can have a home cooked meal without the stigma of being singled out as they are eating with friends together.

# **MENTORING**

- Mentoring referrals are now at 100! Of which 43 have been referred since April
- There are currently 42 matched relationships in progress and 11 referrals awaiting a match
- with 5 mentors newly trained and ready to be matched We are at 600 mentoring meetings already this year

# **MENTORING CASE STUDY**


Chloe (name changed) was referred to our mentoring project in May by her school as she was a 'school non-attender' and was unable to attend lessons without showing signs of extreme anxiety. They were hoping that we could assist by assigning her a mentor to help with her socialisation and to encourage her to return to school. She was matched with Rachel (name changed) in early June and they have met weekly since. Through building a relationship, to exploring what Chloe would like to get out of her sessions and looking at coping strategies for what triggers her anxiety they have developed a really strong bond. Since returning to school in September, Chloe has achieved 100% attendance which is amazing! Now they are working on building resilience and recognising the early signs in case the anxious feelings return. Her Mum says 'Rachel has been fantastic with Chloe and we as parents have seen a massive difference in her confidence in new situations since starting the mentoring with her.'

# **EUROPEAN VOLUNTEER SCHEME**

- In January 2018 we welcomed Monika from Poland and Laura from Germany to our CYZ team as part of their European Volunteer Scheme. Volunteering for us full time was a great opportunity to experience what we do here as well as make their own impact on what we offer

# **XPRESSIONS**

£50k won through a successful public vote to build a studio and run a creative music programme.

Over the last year we've delivered 156 1to1 music tuitions, 42 band practice sessions, multiple specialist tutor visits and live performances.



# **DESMOND'S DINER**

- Hot, affordable, nutritious food at every session a healthy meal for £1 or less
- · Nightly cooking activities teach skills, introduce different foods and cultures, and ensure no-one goes hungry
- · 4154 free home-made meals for young people attending our summer holiday club

In total we had 2082 juniors attend throughout the holidays which equates to 4164 homemade nutritious meals given out.



# **HOLIDAY CLUB / SUMMER PROGRAMME**

 11 weeks holiday provision for 557 young people, with free spaces for those most in need. In the summer, 155 carefully targeted families enjoyed a total of 729 free days, thanks to the generosity of our sponsors; ensuring young people in Carlisle didn't go hungry.

## **SUMMER HITZ CASE STUDY**

Funding received from Department for Education gave free spaces for our summer Holiday Club. Amongst others, we saw an 8 year old Junior Club member who came to HITZ for the first time. We had concerns about him struggling with confidence and making friends, he was always alone in club despite the efforts of the youth workers to help him meet new people. Junior Club is not really long enough at 2 hours, to cement new friendships. HITZ allows us to spend an entire day with our young people and really get to know what makes them tick. We were able to introduce him to another young lad who struggles with similar things and has the same interests. He now comes to Junior Club with his new friend and they regularly go to each other's houses for tea. Mum has said that he is much more sociable at school now and has also made more friends there too.
