A message from our Chair

Dear Friends and Colleagues,

I've just been rereading my introductory message from last year - a cheerful one of progress and ambition written in November `15. Three weeks later we woke to the shock of a flood devastated building and a traumatised community. There followed dark days as the team assessed the damage - we had lost 80% of the space and 90% of our equipment and resources.

I say dark days because it was literally days. The team were magnificent and the community and funders rallied round. Within a week of accessing the building we were open on the upper floors to flood affected children and days later to the whole community. When we couldn't fit them all in (our safety limit having dropped from 500 to 100), we bussed them (with thanks to Stagecoach) to other venues around the city. The team had decided they were not going to let the flood disrupt the service for young people - and have delivered.

In difficult circumstances, we have continued to develop the service - with our burgeoning mentoring programme being just one of the success stories. I hope you'll enjoy reading about our year in this report.

The recovery process has been long and slow. Now, as we approach the anniversary of the flood, we are only just taking back the ground floor space. In a few weeks, I hope to be able to welcome you to your new, improved and more resilient Youth Zone. We have tried to turn crisis into opportunity - and I hope you like the changes we have made.

Our thanks go to everyone (young people, the community, funders, volunteers and the staff team) for enabling this to happen.

Home Ed meets alternate Fridays here at CYZ. It's a group for young people and parents to meet with other families who also home educate. Its central location means families who visit from the rest of the County can find us easily. The group partake in a variety of activities delivered by parents, catch up, relax and enjoy a cuppa! It costs only £1 a visit which covers the cost of PVA glue, paper and other useful resources, the group also organise trips away and invite local organisations in to deliver talks – such as the Great North Air Ambulance.

MENTORING

The Mentoring programme has helped more than 100 young people since it began in August 2014. Volunteers support and advise young people who have behavioural problems, confidence issues or issues at home or school on a 1-2-1 basis for at least 1 hour each week.

Over 40 volunteers have been trained and have worked over 1,500 hours since the start of the programme. It continues to go from strength to strength.

I NEVER KNEW... ... IT WAS THAT BAD STORY OF THE FLOODS

On Saturday 5th December, the Met Office issued a severe weather warning for rain in Cumbria. Storm Desmond was on the way. Nobody could have prepared themselves for the devastating effects it would have on the lives of people living and working within our community.

Cumbria Police declared the situation a "major incident" as many houses and businesses in Carlisle were flooded with 4ft of contaminated water.

We were absolutely heartbroken, Carlisle Youth Zone had been wiped out, losing 80% of operating space and resources, everything that sat on the ground floor of the building had been completely destroyed.

#TeamCYZ was inspiring and confident; Storm Desmond would not beat us! Having gained access to the building, together we worked on plans to continue to ensure every young person living here in Carlisle had a safe and fun place to visit. It's with a massive heartfelt thanks to people, local businesses, volunteers and staff for their generosity and support that we were able to transform the 1st and 2nd floor of the building and were back open after only 10 days!

It's been a challenging few months, working around ongoing building work, lack of space and ability to accommodate the huge number of members who visit CYZ each day. We've hired sports halls and pitches off site so we can continue our sports offering, hired a school hall and Carlisle College to run the Hitz Holiday Club. We've had no kitchen, no music, no sports and yet the team continued to provide a place where young people still want to visit, day after day. That alone makes the battle with Storm Desmond all worthwhile!

Our journey is far from over but at least we can begin to look forward, reclaiming the whole building in all its new glory and welcoming back even more new members than ever before!

How were you effected by flooding?



I live in Salterbeck and get the train to Carlisle to meet my friends at CYZ. I'd been in Carlisle all day and planned to go to Youth Zone on the night but when we got there it was closed.

I couldn't get home and was stranded in Carlisle for three days, the trains had been cancelled and my Mum couldn't get through by car, luckily my friend and her family looked after me until the Tuesday when the flood water started to recede, it took my mum 2 hours to drive through to get me.

How did it make you feel?

I wasn't worried myself as I knew my home was OK but I had a friend that was flooded and I was worried for them because he'd lost all his things.

- Catering, sports and music equipment as well as all our furniture and games GONE

We go through **56 flipchart** pads a year delivering our Mentoring, Volunteer Training, our Sports and Qualifications, our Employability scheme, team training and playing games in our Clubs - Could you help us flip this problem?

Our gym members drink their way through 2,500 plastic cups a year - as much as we encourage gym bottles there's always some who forget - Could you help us quench their thirst?

Our members ping our way through **120** ping pong balls each year - Could you help us fuel our love of the aame?
